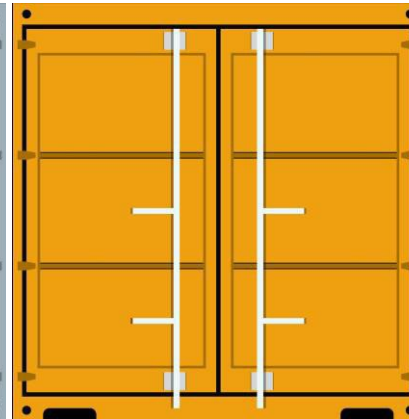
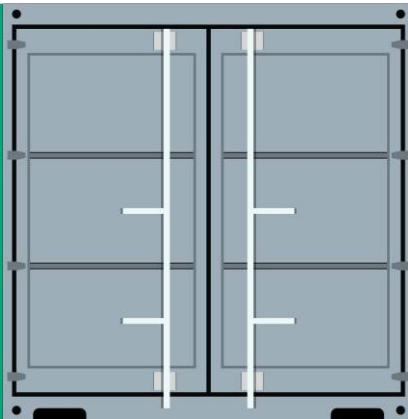
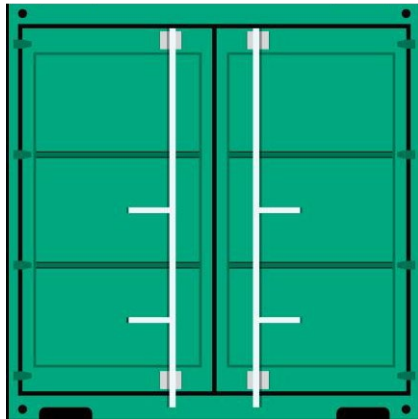


boarding vessels in ports to **ensure** vessels covered by an ITF approved CBA

Financial security

Maritime Labour Convention requires:

Shipowner responsible for repatriation,
outstanding wages & other entitlements

Flag states verify financial security system

When shipowner fails to provide basic
entitlements flag states should step in





Role of the Port State

Records abandonment - ILO/IMO database

Coordinate with all relevant organisations

Port State should take action when others fail

Facilitate repatriation & replacement crew
